





### Be a Bee Friendly Gardener

To all our young gardeners, ecologists, naturalists and wildlife heroes!

Can you help our local wildlife by being a Bee Friendly Gardener?



The Ampthill Buzz is setting up "Bee-Friendly Zones" around our town. You might pass one of our signs on your way to school, or have a "Bee-Friendly Zone" by your home.

But our wildflowers and wildlife need your help too! Your garden joins up with other parks and woods in Ampthill that give food and water to wildlife and places for them

to rest and nest. We can help wildlife by giving them the things that they need in our gardens.

There are lots of ideas of what you can do, but these are our top four:

#### 1. Leave a bit of a lawn to grow and see what wildflowers come up.

Instead of mowing all your lawn, just leave an area to



grow for a few weeks or even for the whole summer and see what comes up.

Do any flowers appear? How many are there? Do you know what they are?



# 2. Plant a flower that bees, butterflies and other bugs like

Bees and butterflies need the flowers in our gardens. They drink the sweet nectar and feed on the pollen inside the plant. Then they share the



pollen with other flowers so the plant can make more of itself. The insects that do this are called <u>pollinators</u>.

Some flowers are better for feeding pollinators. Look out for this special sign when out shopping for plants:

You can try and have a plant in flower all the way through the year. (Watch out for those with a double set of petals though. If you can't see the centre, a bee probably can't get to it either.)



What have you planted recently for bees, butterflies and other bugs? Have the bugs found your plant yet? Was it a bee or butterfly or something else?


## 3. Make a bug hotel by leaving some sticks and stones in a quiet corner

Bugs need somewhere to rest and hide, and a bundle of hollow stems or a small pile of logs or stones may be just what they need.



#### 4. Put out a shallow bowl of water

All creatures including birds and bees need a drink especially on a hot, sunny day!



Have you seen any birds drinking or bathing in the water? What about bees and other insects?
